BLUE GUM POTTERY

One of the earliest potteryys was operated by Potter **JOHN BOYD** along Blue Gum Creek in Chatswood West. Little is known about this pottery

MASHMAN BROTHERS POTTERY

WILLIAM & HENRY MASHMAN founded a pottery in partnership with **James Sanderson** in Victoria Avenue, Chatswood. A key product line was their Regal Artware (later known as Regal Mashman). The site later became the Doulton-Mashman Company, then the Royal Doulton Sanitary Potteries before being taken over by Caroma Industries.

Mashman's main products were pipes, stoneware and utility goods. When **THOMAS STEVENS** joined the firm (from Doulton, England) he made highly coloured pottery with impressed patterns of gum-leaves. This line became known as Regal Artware.

LOMA KYLE LATOUR taught modelling and pottery, and was employed at Mashman Bros. to make Art Deco pieces. One of her premier works was the Egoist, a glazed earthenware bust of George Bernard Shaw.

She executed numerous large-scale plaster, brass and concrete murals and fountains.

RALPH TRAFFORD WALKER had a studio in Hay Market where he designed some vases and figures for the Mashmans.

His model of the Nude Girl was amongst his work. Walker was also involved in designing the bronze doors for the Mitchell Library.
